Note 2

Restrictions

According to the Italian legislation, movements from/to other countries are allowed without motivation.

Restrictions apply in case of transit or stay in List D and/or List E countries during the 14 days prior to entry into Italy.

Some limitations are currently in place in case of transit or stay in the countries listed on list D and/or E during the previous 14 days before enter Italy.

Note 3

Restrictions

According to the Italian legislation, movements from/to other countries are allowed without motivation (without prejudice to the restrictions issued in Italy at Regional level).

Restrictions on entry into Italy are foreseen in case of transit or stay in List E countries during the 14 days prior to entry into Italy.

Fulfilments

On returning to Italy, if you have stayed in or transited through these countries in the previous 14 days, you must:

- ⑩ undergo a molecular or antigenic swab carried out within 72 hours before entry into Italy and the result of which is negative;
- ⑩ you must fill in a self-declaration;
- ⑩ immediately communicate your entry into Italy to the Prevention Department of the Health Company competent for the territory;
- ⑩ reach your final destination in Italy only by private means;
- ⑩ undergo fiduciary isolation and health surveillance for 10 days. This provision applies only to entry into Italy following the entry into force of the Ordinance of 16 April 2021;
- ⑩ undergo an additional molecular or antigenic swab at the end of the 10 day isolation.

The provisions remain in force until 30 July 2021.

Note 4

Restrictions

Travel to the rest of the world is allowed only in the presence of precise reasons, such as:

- ⑩ work
- ⑩ health reasons
- ⑩ study reasons;
- ⑩ absolute urgency
- ⑩ return to your home or residence

Travel for tourism is therefore not allowed.

Italian/EU/Schengen citizens and holders of long-term resident status and their family members is allowed to return to Italy in case of transit/stay within the previous 14 days from this group of Countries (Directive 2004/38/EC). The possibility of entry into Italy from list E countries is also

confirmed for people who have a proven and stable emotional relationship (even if they are not cohabiting) with Italian/EU/Schengen citizens or with individuals who are legally resident in Italy (long term residents) who must reach home/domicile/residence of the partner (in Italy).

Fulfilment

When you return to Italy, if in the 14 days, you need:

- ⑩ to undergo a molecular or antigenic swab carried out within 72 hours before entry into Italy and the result of which is negative;
- ⑩ you must fill in a self-declaration;
- ⑩ to undergo fiduciary isolation and health surveillance for 10 days. This provision applies only to entry into Italy following the entry into force of the Ordinance of 16 April 2021;
- ⑩ to undergo an additional molecular or antigenic swab at the end of the 10 days of isolation.

Those who entered Italy before 18 April 2021 must complete the 14-day period of isolation and must not carry out further tests and reach their final destination in Italy only by private vehicle. There is also the obligation to immediately communicate their entry into Italy to the prevention department of the health care company competent for the territory to the local health company. See the COVID-19 toll-free page and Regional information;

The provisions remain in force until 30 July 2021.

Note 5

The entry and transit in the national territory are forbidden for persons who have stayed or passed through Brazil in the previous 14 days.

Entry and air traffic from Brazil are permitted provided that no Covid-19 symptoms occur only in the following categories:

- ⑩ those who have registered residence in Italy from a date prior to 13 February 2021 (with self-declaration without the authorization of the Ministry of Health)
- ⑩ those who have to reach the domicile, home or residence of minor children, spouse or part of the civil union
- ⑩ with self-declaration without authorization from the Ministry of Health
- ⑩ to subjects in conditions of absolute necessity authorized by the Ministry of Health

Notwithstanding:

- ⑩ the obligation of a negative molecular or antigenic swab performed in the preceding 72 hours
- ⑩ the obligation of a negative molecular or antigenic test performed upon arrival at the airport in the event of arrival at the port or border place even within 48 hours at the local health authority of reference
- ⑩ regardless of the test result, the obligation to undergo fiduciary isolation and health surveillance for a period of 10 days
- ⑩ obligation to carry out an additional molecular or antigenic swab at the end of the 10-day quarantine

CREW AND TRAVELLING PERSONNEL

The crew and travelling personnel of vehicles transporting persons and goods are allowed to enter Italy and are always exempt from quarantine, without the need for authorisation by the Ministry of Health, provided that no symptoms of COVID-19 appear, without prejudice to the obligation to self-declare and undergo a molecular or antigenic test, to be carried out by means of a swab, upon arrival at the airport, port or border location, where possible, or within forty-eight hours of entry into national territory at the local health authority of reference.

For seafarers, the provisions of annex 28 of the President of the Council of Ministers on 2 March 2021 on the protocol to reach a ship for embarkation, for free exit or to leave a ship for repatriation

also remain in force.

Exemption from quarantine subject to authorization by the Ministry of Health.

Entry into Italy is permitted, provided that no Covid-19 symptoms occur and with the prior authorization of the Ministry, without prejudice to:

- ⑩ the obligation of self-declaration
- ⑩ the obligation of a negative molecular or antigenic swab performed in the preceding 72 hours
- ⑩ the obligation of a negative molecular or antigenic swab performed upon arrival at the airport, or in the case of arrival at the port or along the border even within 48 hours at the local health company of reference

Only for the following categories of subjects:

- ⑩ entry to Italy for less than 120 hours for proven work, health or absolute urgency needs;
- ⑩ to the personnel of companies and entities having their registered office or secondary office in Italy for travel abroad with proven work needs lasting no more than 120 hours;
- ⑩ officials and agents of the European Union or international organizations, diplomatic agents, administrative and technical staff of diplomatic missions, consular officers and employees, military personnel, including those returning from international missions, and police forces, to the personnel of the information system for the safety of the Republic and firemen in the performance of their functions.

These measures are valid until 30 July 2021.

Exemptions for admissions to national sports competitions that take place in Italy

Also in this case, the exemption is activated by self-declaration, so it is not necessary to request it, from the Ministry of Health.

It applies as per current legislation to the following categories:

at the entrances of athletes, technicians, judges, race commissioners and accompanying persons, representatives of the foreign press for participation in sports competitions that take place in Italy and in compliance with the provisions of Article 18 paragraph 1.

It is mandatory that in the 48 hours prior to entering the national territory, the aforementioned categories have undergone a molecular or antigenic test, carried out by means of a swab and negative result.

Entries are also allowed from those countries from which entry into Italy is prohibited as per art. 49 paragraph 5 Prime Ministerial Decree of 2 March 2021.

The reference organizations for this exemption are CONI and CIP (Article 18 paragraph 1).

Participants are required to comply with the protocols issued by the respective national sports federations, associated sports disciplines and sports promotion bodies.
